


How to create WordPress demo site

1. Login [Dreamersi](#) as administrator.
*If you forgot your password, please click “Forgot Password”, the recovery email link will be sent to the primary contact email address for your domain.


2. Click “WordPress PHP 7”.




3. Click “Install WordPress PHP 7”.



4. Click **“Close”**.




5. Click **“SQL Database icon”**.




***1 Please DO NOT click “Go Live” unless you are sure to publish the website. This will delete your current website and publish new WordPress website.**

6. Click **“Add New Database”**.



7. Create a password, confirm it, and click **“Add”**.





10. Click “WordPress PHP 7 (demo)” on the upper left of the page.






11. Click **WordPress Login link**.


14. Enter database connection details and click “Submit”. The information is at [Step 9](#). (Example)


15. Click **“Run the installation”**.



16. Fill out information for your WordPress website and click **“Install WordPress”**.




17. Click “Log In”.

19. Click “Log In”.







To access your WordPress admin site

1. Once you are ready to publish your WordPress demo site, go to WordPress PHP 7, and click “Go Live”.


